Cycling Queensland

Position statement

1. Cycling Queensland (CQ) a constituent Association of the Australian Cycling Federation Inc, its clubs and its members, is committed to providing a sport environment which is free from the use of prohibited substances to enhance performance.
2. CQ condemns the use of prohibited substances in cycling and believe it is both dangerous to the health of the athlete as well as contrary to the ethics of sportsmanship.
CQ will not tolerate prohibited drug use and will adopt anti doping policies and practices.

Recognition of the Australian Cycling Federation Anti Doping Policy

3. All members of CQ holding an ACF membership card are members of the Australian Cycling Federation (ACF).
4. The ACF Anti Doping Policy is recognised as the policy that will be responsible for the management of Queensland athletes. The ACF is recognised as the body responsible for the implementation of the policy where a person is found to have participated in a doping practice.
5. The ACF Anti Doping Policy applies to any person who is a member of the ACF, CQ or any body affiliated with the ACF.
6. The ACF Anti Doping Policy applies to any person taking part in or involved with any sporting activity conducted or authorised by the ACF.
7. CQ endorses the approach for dealing with a positive drug test as outlined in the ACF Anti Doping Policy.
8. CQ for the purposes of undertaking an agreement between Sport and Recreation Queensland for the Queensland Government User Pays Drug Testing Program has adopted the ACF Anti Doping Policy. This policy applies to all members of CQ and ACF.

Recognition of the Australian Sports Drug Agency (ASDA)

9. ASDA is recognised as the key agency in Australia for the sampling and testing of athletes for the detection of a doping practice.

10. CQ recognises the importance of education and information initiatives and will support the dissemination of information relating to doping practices.

CQ Obligations

11. CQ will enter into a separate agreement with Sport and Recreation Queensland (SRQ) for ASDA to undertake drug testing services in accordance with the provisions of the ASDA Act (1990) and:
12. Provide ASDA with accurate contact details of athletes to enable ASDA to contact athletes selected randomly for out of competition testing;
13. Permit and assist ASDA to attend competitions conducted by CQ or under the auspices of CQ in order to obtain samples for testing of any doping practice.
14. Permit and assist ASDA to obtain samples for testing from CQ members out of competition;
15. Notify our athletes, coaches and administrators that they are liable for selection to provide samples for testing for detection of any doping practices; and

Sanctions

16. CQ endorses the approach for dealing with positive drug tests as outlined in the ACF Anti Doping Policy.
17. CQ endorses the sanctions contained in the ACF anti Doping Policy and expects that the appropriate sanctions will be applied to a CQ member found to have participated in a doping practice.
