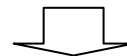

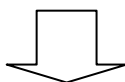
Read the manual and complete the Workbook within a 3 month period of receiving it. Once completed, post or email your workbook to CYCLING QUEENSLAND (PO BOX 4115, GUMDALE, QLD, 4154 or gld.info@cycling.org.au).

The workbook will be sent to a Commissaire Assessor to be marked - an 80% pass grade is required (The Assessor or State Development Officer will contact you with your result).

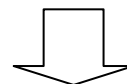
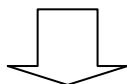


Hit the road or the track (or both!) and gain some practical Commissaire experience at events, preferably under the guidance of a Commissaire Mentor. This practical experience (minimum of 10hrs) needs to be documented in the logbook provided and signed by the Chief Commissaire at the event.

Hit the road or the track (or both!) and gain some practical Commissaire experience at events, preferably under the guidance of a Commissaire Mentor. This practical experience (15hrs road and 15hrs track) needs to be documented in the logbook provided and signed by the Chief Commissaire at the event.



Contact a Cycling Queensland Commissaire Assessor and arrange a mutually agreeable time/competition to be assessed within. A Commissaire assessors list is available in the commissaires section at www.gld.cycling.org.au



Volunteer to be a Commissaire at club events and consolidate your new knowledge and skills.

Club Commissaires are encouraged to apply to be general Commissaires at events outside of their Club to develop their skills. Expressions of Interest for Commissaires are issued every road and track season.

Volunteer to be a Commissaire at Restricted Open events or higher to consolidate your new knowledge and skills.

State Commissaires apply for Chief, Principal or General Commissaires roles at all levels of competition to develop their skills. Expressions of Interest for Commissaires are sought every road and track season.



Active Commissaires within Queensland are able to:

- ✓ Express their interest to Commissaire at all Queensland events
- ✓ Attend workshops which detail Rule and Regulation changes as they occur (no expense)
 - ✓ Nominate themselves to become a member of the Technical Committee
 - ✓ Get a discounted Cycling Queensland/Cycling Australia license
- ✓ Be right in the thick of the action at some of the best cycle races in Australia



The next accreditation phase is to become a Level 2 Commissaire which entitles the Commissaire to officiate State and Open Championships.

For the Level 2 Commissaire Accreditation Process follow the alternate side of this document.

The next development opportunity for the Level 2 Commissaire is to obtain their Level 3 Commissaire Accreditation which is required to officiate at National Level competitions.

Remember that all Commissaires who volunteer at road and track events receive entitlements. Entitlements vary for Chief, Principal and General Commissaires and volunteers. Specific information on entitlements can be requested from the CQ Office at any time..
